AND GOD SAYS . . .

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith — and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— not by works, so that no one can boast. 10 For we are God’s workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. (Ephesians 2:8-10 NIV)

When I lead a study through the book of Ephesians and we read the first chapter, I ask those in the study to look for all that God does for us so that we can be saved from our sin and become part of his family and then look for all that we need to do to be saved. This is always an eye-opening exercise.

When we get done reading, those reading with me realize that God does everything for us to be saved while we do nothing except believe. According to Ephesians, chapter 1, God blessed us “with every spiritual blessing in Christ.” This means “he chose us in Christ ... to be holy and blameless in his sight,” But even more, “he predestined us to be adopted as his children through Jesus Christ.” Furthermore, “in Christ we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins.” And then, get this, he doesn’t do the minimum to save us, but instead the Scriptures say that he does all this “in accordance with the riches of [his] grace that he lavished on us.” Isn’t that something?

But he still isn’t done. He then “made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure” and then marked us “with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God’s possession — to the praise of his glory.” This is all God’s doing. It is all about his work in us.

Now get this. The verse quoted above tells us that even our faith isn’t of our own doing, but of God’s enablement. It is his grace bestowed on us. Isn’t that awesome? The result is, we have nothing to boast about in ourselves, but rather only to praise God for loving us so much that he did all this to save us. This is what real love is all about.

So what is our part? What do we do? Why, we believe him, that’s what. Then in response of gratefulness, we do his good works.

Black River Falls FFA 2024-2025 Activities

The Black River Falls FFA theme this year is “Rooted in Agriculture - Because Leaders Are Grown Not Born.” Our officer team created this theme at our annual summer officer retreat. We created it with the thought that our activities in agriculture and FFA help us to constantly improve our leadership skills. I would like to give you a brief overview of some of our many different FFA activities from last year.

We grow leaders. This year we had many wonderful travel opportunities to various destinations and one of them was the Fall Leadership Workshop in Melrose, with our State FFA Officers! Students had the opportunity to attend workshops hosted by our State FFA Officer team, meet other students from around our section, learn what other chapters have been doing this year, and even have the opportunity to work one on one with some of our state officers. Our FFA Quiz Bowl and Parliamentary Procedure teams competed in the Leadership Development Events (LDE) on February 3rd. FFA members traveled to the State FFA Convention in Madison Wisconsin this past June and the National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana this past fall. At these conventions they met other student leaders, interacted with agricultural industry professionals, received recognitions, heard motivational speakers, attended a concert, FFA dance, and participated in workshops. Our chapter officers spent a couple days in the summer planning out our activities for the year and then followed up with monthly meetings and a winter get-together to keep our chapter on a good course. With summer coming to a close, we held an outdoor drive-in movie night along with halfway through the school year we celebrated our members involvement with a recreational/social activity at Bruce Mound. FFA members exhibited their Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) projects in an online format for a virtual SAE Fair and were scored and received feedback on how to improve and expand their projects. We continued to run our FFA Student Cooperative, which consists of managing our agronomy test plot, electing a board of directors from our student body, and working closely with Jackson Electric Cooperative and Allied Cooperative.

We help build our communities. We plant trees, shrubs, and flowers around the school campus. Christmas tree pick up within the city of Black River Falls is a cold, but popular activity. Vegetable planters are created and taken to various group homes in our community. The Agritvity Area outside the school greenhouse continues to be developed into an excellent learning area and even produces some vegetables for the food pantry. We raised money for Heifer International and the Jackson County Animal Shelter. We conducted a Shoe Drive with other FFA Chapters in our county to raise money for the Animal Shelter.

We strengthen agriculture. We sold shakes with our FFA Alumni & Supporters Group at the county fair. To promote our chapter we created a display board, conducted radio interviews, organized a spring awards banquet, and celebrated National FFA Week. Our Food For America program included a field day for all the fourth graders at Jackson Electric Cooperative. We also made cheese with them in their classrooms with help from the Jackson County Dairy Promotion Committee. We supplied child daycares in our county with garden planters and supplies to teach little ones about growing food.

Our chapter had some significant special recognitions this year. At the Jackson County Fair our chapter display board won a blue and outstanding ribbon and the swine exhibit received a herdsmanship award. Our FFA Chapter was selected to be the focus of this year's Falls History Project. Jennifer Marecek and Katie Sedelbauer received the State FFA Degree in Madison. Keegan Ottum and Preston Konicki received a silver at the State FFA Agriscience Fair competition in June.

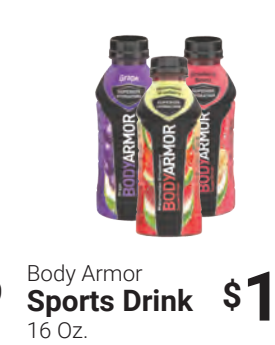

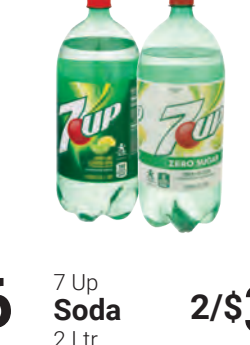
