The Common Council meeting in annual session was called to order by Mayor Poeschel. On roll call: Council Member Counsell absent, all other members present.

The City Clerk swore in Duane G. Poeschel, Barbara A. Petkovsek and Clarissa M. Rochester for their terms in their respective offices.

The Council welcomed Duane G. Poeschel (Mayor), Barbara A. Petkovsek (Third Ward Council Member) and Clarissa M. Rochester (Fourth Ward Council Member) as newly elected and re-elected members.

Mayor Poeschel announced that the purpose of this meeting is to reorganize the Council and make appointments of the various officials, boards, committees and commissions. Mayor Poeschel presented nominees for Council consideration.
