Water Customers of the City of Neillsville Municipal Water Utility

This is to give you notice that the City of Neillsville Municipal Water Utility will file an application on June 25, 2025, with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC), for authority to increase water rates. Rates for general service will increase 3.0 percent. The increase is necessary to reduce the existing deficiency in present rates. The request is being made under Wis. Stat. 196.193. Rate increases granted under this statute do not require a public hearing. The effect of the increase for some selected customers is shown below. Public Fire Protection and Wholesale rates (if applicable) will also increase 3.0 percent.

The last time the Water Utility raised rates was in December of 2013.

2025 Comprehensive Plan Amendment Notice

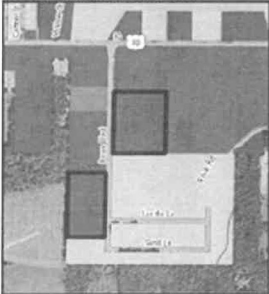
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held at the Neillsville City Hall, 106 W Division Street, Neillsville, WI 54456, on the 10th day of July, 2025 at the 6:15 p.m. Planning Commission meeting, to consider a 2025 Comprehensive Plan amendment for the City of Neillsville, Wisconsin. Copies of the 2025 Comprehensive Plan amendment are available for viewing on the City of Neillsville website at <https://neillsville-wi.com> or during normal office hours at the Neillsville Public Library, 409 Hewett Street, or at City Hall, 106 W Division Street.

The 2025 Comprehensive Plan amendment proposes to change the Preferred Future Land Use Map found on page 162 of the City of Neillsville Comprehensive Plan, which was adopted by the City Council on August 19, 2021. It is proposed to change the preferred future land uses from Commercial to Residential on Lot 2 CSM #1116 (8 acres) and from Commercial to Residential on Lot 4 Boon Commercial Park (10.53 acres) in the Comprehensive Plan. The Planning Commission may consider additional changes to the Preferred Future Land Use Map in this immediate area to accommodate future residential or mixed-use development along Boon Boulevard.

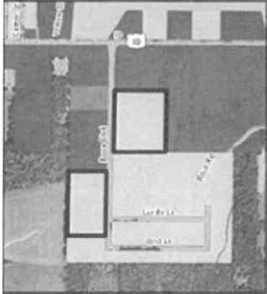

The Common Council met in regular session, Mayor Poeschel presiding. On roll call: Council Members Petkovsek and Rochester absent, all other members present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The minutes of the previous meeting were declared approved.

Council Member Neville reported on the May 13, 2025 meeting of the Library Board regarding: 1) librarians' reports, 2) discussion on Library policy revision, 3) discussion on and approval of library parking lot resurfacing with Struck & Irwin Paving, Inc. applying two coats of micro-surfacing to the asphalt at a cost of \$5,267.50, 4) payment of bills and 5) updates on donation and carryover funds.
