Resolution 4-2-23 APPROVING APPLICATION FOR BOATING AND FISHING GRANT – ROCK DAM LAKE BOAT LAUNCH IMPROVEMENT PROJECT presented.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Clark County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the application and requests assistance from the DNR for the replacement of the Rock Dam Boat Launch consistent with the terms above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Clark County will meet the financial obligations necessary to fully and satisfactorily complete the project and hereby authorizes and empowers the Clark County Forestry and Parks Administrator to submit the following documents to the DNR for financial assistance that may be available: sign and submit the Recreational Boating Facilities grant application; sign the Agreement/Contract between applicant and the DNR; submit required reports to the DNR to satisfy the Agreement/Contract; submit reimbursement request(s) to the DNR; sign and submit other required documentation as necessary to complete the project per the Agreement/Contract; and shall take any necessary action to undertake, direct, and complete the Rock Dam Lake Boat Launch Improvement Project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Clark County will comply with all local, state, and federal rules, regulations, and ordinances relating to this project and the cost-share Agreement/Contract; may perform force account work; will maintain the completed project in an attractive, inviting and safe manner; will keep the facilities open to the general public during reasonable hours consistent with the type of facility; and will obtain approval from the DNR before any change is made in the use of the project site (if applicable).

Motion by Supervisor Bower seconded by Supervisor Sebesta to approve the amended resolution that was distributed at the Board meeting. Motion by Supervisor Gerhardt seconded by Supervisor Schindler to strike the following wording; “and last much longer, which has lasted over 35 years” on line #24. So that it reads: WHEREAS, the proposed boat ramp will greatly reduce the maintenance costs for ramp repairs than the existing concrete plank ramp. Supervisor C. Rueth yielded the floor to Curtiss Lindner to explain the resolution and answer questions.

Roll call vote on the amendment, motion carried. 27 yes, 1 no and 1 absent. Voting no was Supervisor Bower. Supervisor Thielman was absent.

Roll call vote on Resolution 4-2-23 as amended, motion carried. 28 yes and 1 absent. Absent was Supervisor Thielman.
